

## Husband & Wife Team Work Together in Harmony

dance class with a single guy unless you plan to marry him," Christie recently joked, her serene and poised nature pleasantly accenting her polished, attractive persona.

"The experience of taking dance classes allowed us to get to know each other very well and after getting to know each other better we realized we made sense on various levels," she added, with a smile.

The design and construction dynamo met in Oregon when a married couple asked their friend Robert, a selfemployed contractor, to help with an important project: Build a home for single mom Christie Adams.

Their mutual admiration was parallel: Christie embraced Robert because his expertise was highly regarded and admired in their Oregon town, while "Christie was - and is - a very talented designer and more than that, the kind of girl to take home and introduce to your mother," Robert states.

Now married 19 years - the same number of years they have been

"Our goal is that the client never knew where the old house started and the new space began."


Robert is described by his wife as the "framework expert" who "understands the structural process while Christie says her role is to perfect interior details providing clients professional feedback on internal elements and a special expertise in kitchen and bathroom design, including a hard-earned certification with the National Kitchen & Bath Association.

"I believe what we make as a team is the Yin and Yang, the Beauty and the Beast approach," Robert joked. "I know the nuts and bolts of the profession and she brings the feminine perspective to the table.

"What we have found oftentimes is that one person in the duo is the driving force of the remodeling or home construction process," Robert recently explained of the husbandwife teams for which they often work. "Somewhere along the line the other person will want their voice heard and they want someone there to facilitate that."

Hearing clients' voices and desires then crafting them to epitomize their personal space is both Board's primary objective. When viewing her final product, it is clear Christie designs an interior to reflect the essence of its occupants, not her own.
